



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Paid Union Meetings for Teachers & Principal

This year the Teachers & Principal Collective Agreement is up for renewal, this happens every 3 years. All teachers & Kat will be attending Paid Union Meetings during the school day this term. These meetings are important as they help form the next steps of our negotiations with the government.
